MESSAGE FROM THE MENAHEL



Dear Parents,

It is so refreshing to be back in the rhythm and routine of a flourishing, vibrant school year. As we leave the lofty period of the **ירח האיתנים**-the powerful spiritual injection of Elul, Rosh Hashana, Yom Kippur and Sukkot, we enter these winter months with full suitcases packed with inspiration. And, what better tool is there to cultivate these lessons than our very precious Sefer Bereshit, packed with life lessons and meaning in every **פסוק**!

In this week's **פרשה**, the **תורה** describes what happened when the Egyptians discovered **שרי** who was hidden from them. **פרעה**-and they praised her to **פרעה**. They didn't just tell **פרעה**. They praised her to **פרעה**. As **שלמה המלך** writes in **מהללו** **לפי ואיש** **ספר משלי-ואיש**. Just as a furnace removes the impurities from gold and silver and presents you with these metals in their purest form, so too man can be measured by what he praises.

If you want to get to know the true essence of a person, listen carefully to what they get excited about. Imagine that three people go to a wedding, one goes home talking about how delicious the food was, one describes how beautifully the chuppah, flower arrangements, and decor were set up, and the third talks about the deep aura of Kedusha which was felt throughout the ceremony. Each of these people are telling us a tremendous amount about themselves and what they value most.

While this tool from **שלמה המלך** is a great barometer to get a better understanding of the people around us, it's also a painfully accurate tool to measure our own spiritual status. Pay attention to what gets you excited and what you praise, and you'll get to know yourself a whole lot better in the process! And, as parents, we have an extra great responsibility to pay attention to our words because, even more than we realize, our kids are paying very, very close attention to what makes us tick...and they are framing their own world around our words-truely humbling and scary to think about!

Maybe this is a good time to apply the old slogan "fake it till you make it!" Let's talk openly in our homes and get EXCITED about Torah, Mitzvot, Shiurim, Tefilah and everything else that we want our children to live their lives based on. You never know, it might just cause us to live our lives on a much higher plane, in the process!

We had our first ביאורי תפילה quiz on the meaning of ברוך שאמר, and all the girls did beautifully ב"ה. In עברית, we learnt a unit on school related words and spent time on the concept of התאמה. The girls found examples of התאמה in חומש and נביא, showing that they truly mastered the concept! We learned all about פטירת רחל אמנו and the value of being mevater. 4th GRADE NEWS-GENERAL STUDIES

The amazing girls of Mrs. Palatt's 4th grade have been busy exploring and learning about many topics! They have read interesting mini biographies about Mae Jemison, the first African American female astronaut and space scientist, and about Henry Wells and William G. Fargo, the founders of Wells Fargo Bank. We've even discussed how today's system of banking works and how it was established, (before ATMs!) with questions arising including how banks actually earn money!

A favorite part of 4th grade is the Bonus Point system of rewarding students for their exemplary behavior and outstanding work. Points are given for quietly getting ready for a lesson, listening, working with focus without socializing, and for completing extra credit work. The majority of the extra credit assignments are challenging, thought provoking, and focus on critical thinking skills. In addition, the girls like working on the word searches, word puzzles, and complex coloring pages. "How many points do I have?" is a question taken care of with small charts that each student is given to keep track of their points. I am the only one allowed to write on the master chart!

Math is a popular subject with the 4th grade girls! The lessons have focused on working with large numbers, from the hundred thousands to the millions. The girls love being challenged and enjoy using their individual dry erase boards to solve problems. It is so refreshing to teach girls that embrace math and take pride in their mastery of skills! The girls are enjoying the multiplication "Ice Cream Challenge", a fun way to encourage them to learn their basic facts by heart. One set of facts is tested at a time, for example, we just did the 6s. There is a quick timed drill (45 seconds!) with only 12 problems. The goal is of course to get 100%. In the case of missed problems, there is a make-up test until 100% is achieved. When all the times tables have been mastered by the whole class, a special surprise awaits the girls!
